A Note about Music from Simon and Fr. Chris

The Annual Christmas Concert will also not take place this year, for the same reason.



St. John's Rose Window beautifully adorns the East wall of the church, behind the altar. In the center, the Lord Jesus is enthroned in heaven as King and surrounding him are the saints of God, specifically the Twelve Apostles, each occupying one of the twelve "rose petals." Each petal contains a symbol which corresponds to the respective Apostle. If one were to stand at the very back of the church, looking East at the Rose Window, they would see that the nave of the church is flanked by six windows on both sides. Each of these also represent one of the Apostles. As we move forward towards the altar for Holy Communion, we recognize that we are surrounded by the "great cloud of witnesses" of the saints as we worship (Hebrews 12:1). The heavenly and earthly realms seem to meet at the focal point of the altar where Christ the King makes himself uniquely available and present to the faithful in the Bread and the Wine of the Eucharist. From that point on, if we were to once again glance at the Rose Window as we return to our pews, we would understand that we are meant to find our final place alongside those saints of God worshipping Christ on his heavenly throne forever.
