**THE SECOND LESSON:**

Romans 8:26-39

The Spirit helps us in our weakness; for we do not know how to pray as we ought, but that very Spirit intercedes with sighs too deep for words. And God, who searches the heart, knows what is the mind of the Spirit, because the Spirit intercedes for the saints according to the will of God. We know that all things work together for good for those who love God, who are called according to his purpose. For those whom he foreknew he also predestined to be conformed to the image of his Son, in order that he might be the firstborn within a large family. And those whom he predestined he also called; and those whom he called he also justified; and those whom he justified he also glorified. What then are we to say about these things? If God is for us, who is against us? He who did not withhold his own Son, but gave him up for all of us, will he not with him also give us everything else? Who will bring any charge against God's elect? It is God who justifies. Who is to condemn? It is Christ Jesus, who died, yes, who was raised, who is at the right hand of God, who indeed intercedes for us. Who will separate us from the love of Christ? Will hardship, or distress, or persecution, or famine, or nakedness, or peril, or sword? As it is written, "For your sake we are being killed all day long; we are accounted as sheep to be slaughtered." No, in all these things we

are more than conquerors through him who loved us. For I am convinced that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor rulers, nor things present, nor things to come, nor powers, nor height, nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord.

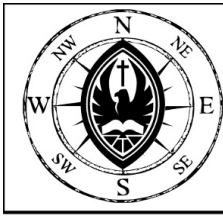

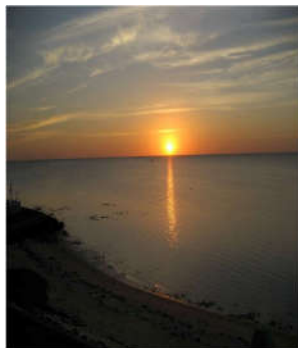

## Music Notes

The eagle-eyed among those in the church over the next several weeks might notice a space on the south chancel wall, vacated by the 8' Trompette stop of the Great division of the organ. This stop has been removed by organ techs Ron Streicher and Joe Wiessinger (shown here) for shipping to the Reuter Organ Company in Lawrence, KS, where they will be fitted with new shallots, tongues, tuning slides and wires - all component parts of a reed pipe and which make it "speak." The other picture here shows the largest pipes of the rank on the carpet in front of the altar. You will see that the feet of some of these pipes have begun to bend under their own weight. This, too, will be corrected by Reuters before being shipped back to Tampa, where each pipe will be tuned, regulated and voiced by Ron and Joe for its home surroundings. This work should result in vastly improved sound quality and projection, after thirty-six years of life "on the wall!"



## IWC Reflection

Connect is the third pillar of Invite Welcome Connect. Paul's letter to the Romans tells us that we are all members of the Body of Christ and that everyone of us has special gifts to contribute and to receive. In the Connect mode we are intentionally helping each other find those special gifts. Good connection answers the questions "Where do I belong?" and "How do I belong?" If a person cannot answer these questions, then there is little likelihood that they will stay in the church. Out the back door they go! The task requires "Holy Listening," which is the practice of hearing and honoring another's story as it unfolds and then discerning what gifts and interests, hopes and fears, are embedded, so that meaningful connections can be made. The task for the church is to create and maintain healthy spaces of belonging in response to the guidance of the Holy Spirit. Fellowships, prayer and study groups, worship, and ministries are some of the categories where we find our place within the church and in the Body of Christ. For us to flourish as a connection-oriented community requires empowering lay persons to think creatively.
