Music Notes from Simon Morley

As many of you are aware, we have experienced some transition in St. John's Choir between the end of last season and the beginning of this. Whilst we have known considerable stability in recent years, this is commonplace in most choirs, especially in the UK, whereby boy and girl choristers leave the top year of the choir to head to high school, together with choral scholars who have spent a year in the choir between school and university. Thus, there is always yearly movement, and this can be a healthy thing. I am delighted to be able to report that we remain in good shape, and welcome new members to our ranks, together with some who are returning after a hiatus.

A rather belated welcome, at least in writing, to alto Julz Ericson, who has sung with us since earlier this year. Julz is a 2012 graduate of the Peabody Conservatory, where she received her B.M. in vocal performance. Lauren Krockta joins us a soprano from the Cathedral in St. Petersburg. Lauren is a very experienced singer whom I have known for some years from working with other choral groups. Carole Page has rejoined the choir, again as a soprano, and her musicianship and knowledge of the music program is invaluable. Many will remember her son, Kevin, who was a boy chorister here, and who early on developed a keen interest in the organ, playing for many services and concerts before heading to college. Matt Hughes joins us as a tenor. Matt has sung with us on many occasions, and brings with him huge experience, having sung in the Choir of Trinity Wall Street, New York City, prior to relocating to Tampa. Last, but by no means least, Taylor Johnston rejoins us as a bass. Taylor recently retired from the Air Force, and he and his wife, Alex, were married here at St. John's in 2013. It is very good to welcome these singers to or back to our ranks, and I extend my thanks also to the existing members of the choir for their commitment and service.

As is always the case following a change in personnel, it takes time to establish the blend and manage the repertoire in a way that doesn't overstretch the choir. I have always taken the view that it is far better, in the early days, to do simpler music, well. As those who know me will tell you, I have never subscribed to the "That's Good Enough School of Music," and I don't intend to enroll now!
